New Lectionary beginning on the first Sunday of Advent 2024. The new Lectionary will use the English Standard Version - Catholic Edition of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter (the psalms).


The Lectionary, which is the book that contains the Scripture readings for Mass and the Sacraments, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The changes are intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, biblical scholarship, and to provide a text for use in the liturgical setting that is more suited to public proclamation and, where appropriate, more inclusive. Text is set in sense lines for ease of reading and hearing.


Those who use Sunday and weekday Mass missals will need new ones for the readings. The Collins editions are already available via Amazon @ £14.75 and £22.65 respectively, with free postage. We will also get some for sale in the church shop in due course. A Missal is essential for all Ministers of the word who read at Mass.

The UNIVERSALIS app has the new translation already inserted from 1st Sunday of Advent onward. It can be viewed now by going to any date from 1st December. The 'sense lines' format, for easier public reading, can be selected in the menu.

The four church volumes listed below will cost £173 each. Exquisitely bound in padded leather, and adorned with gold-blocking, gilded edges and multiple ribbon markers, these volumes are both sturdy and worthy for the proclamation of the Word of God.

Sacrament of Confirmation at St Aidan's 2025.

Year 9 pupils or older are now being invited to enrol for the preparation programme.

We need to have the Confirmation Mass earlier in the year in future as the summer term is so full with school trips, Duke of E and sports events, it has become very difficult. As we would not want Confirmations in Lent, it leaves the beginning of February as the best time. so we will need to begin soon.

The Confirmation preparation programme will begin in the church hall on Sunday evenings on Sunday 6th October. Half term and Christmas holidays come during the preparation period. **The application forms will be available from Fr Peter after Masses** today and for the next couple of weeks.

Mass attendance is an essential requirement for any prospective applicant.

The young person applying needs to request the form personally, NOT A PARENT.

The St Aidan's programme is not open to people from other parishes. On the application form the applicants are asked to write a short account in handwriting saying why they wish to be confirmed.

Today's readings:

First Reading ISAIAH 35:4-7

Say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.' Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy; for water gushes in the desert, streams in the wasteland, the scorched earth becomes a lake, the parched land springs of water.

Responsorial Psalm PSALM 145(146):7-10

My soul, give praise to the Lord.

It is the Lord who keeps faith for ever, who is just to those who are oppressed. It is he who gives bread to the hungry, the Lord, who sets prisoners free.

It is the Lord who gives sight to the blind, who raises up those who are bowed down. It is the Lord who loves the just, the Lord, who protects the stranger.

The Lord upholds the widow and orphan but thwarts the path of the wicked.
The Lord will reign for ever,
Zion's God, from age to age.

Second Reading JAMES 2:1-5

My brothers, do not try to combine faith in Jesus

Christ, our glorified Lord, with the making of distinctions between classes of people. Now suppose a man comes into your synagogue, beautifully dressed and with a gold ring on, and at the same time a poor man comes in, in shabby clothes, and you take notice of the well-dressed man, and say, 'Come this way to the best seats'; then you tell the poor man, 'Stand over there' or 'You can sit on the floor by my foot-rest.' Can't you see that you have used two different standards in your mind, and turned yourselves into judges, and corrupt judges at that?

Listen, my dear brothers: it was those who are poor according to the world that God chose, to be rich in faith and to be the heirs to the kingdom which he promised to those who love him.

Gospel MARK 7:31-37

Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha', that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. 'He has done all things well,' they said 'he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.'
